13. The Summer House Garden

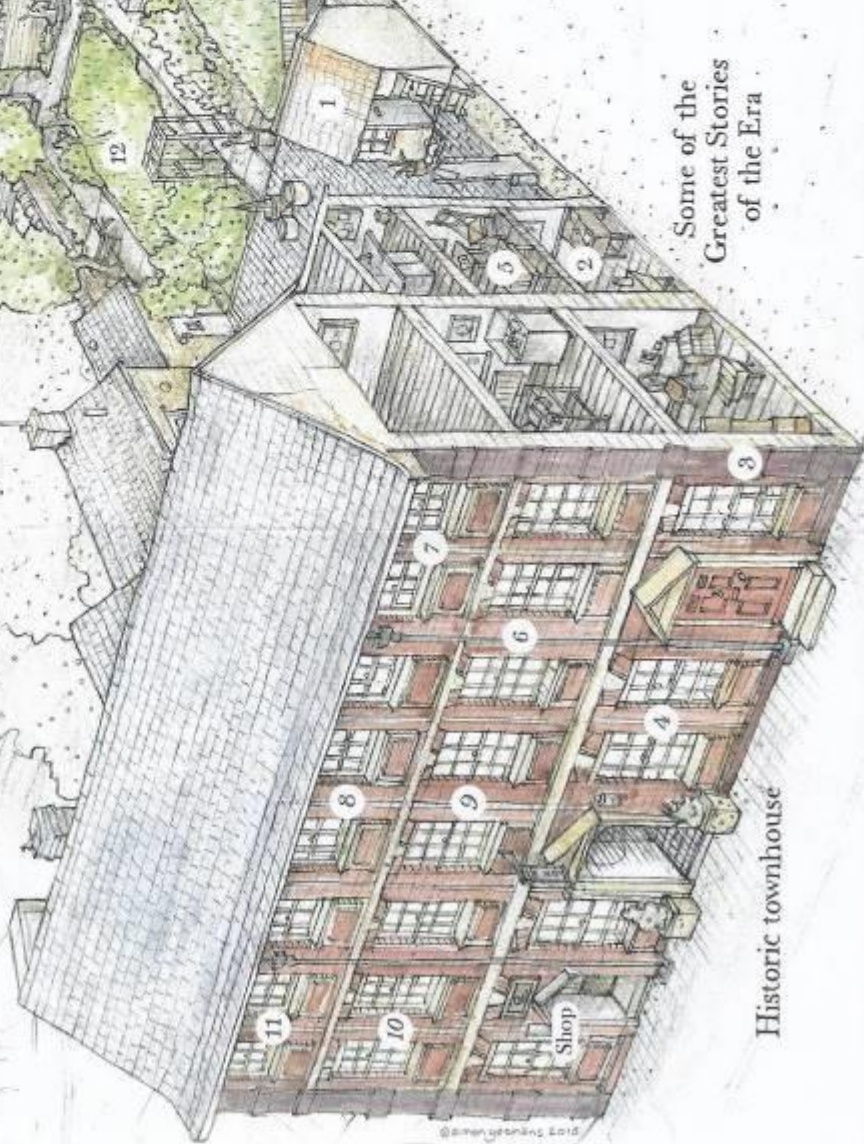

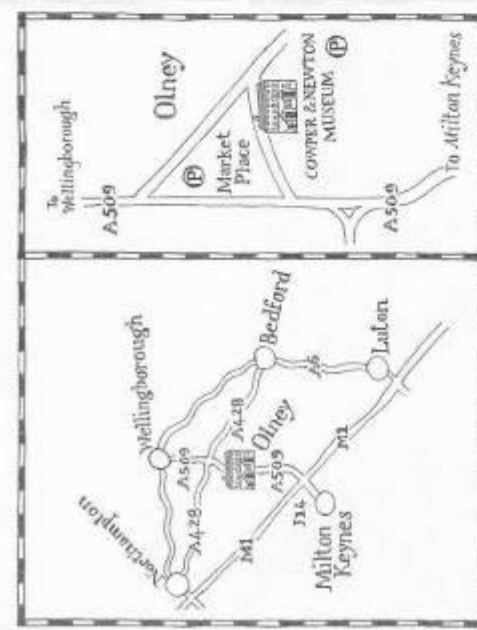
14. Olney Parish Church

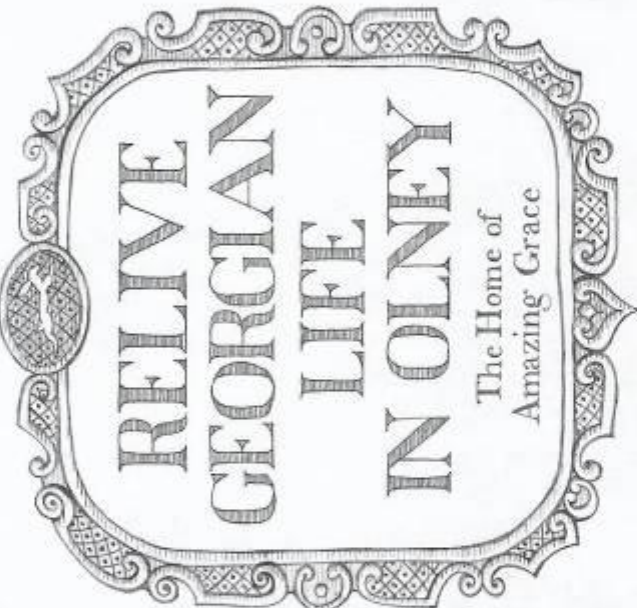

- * **Disabled access:** Wheelchair/mobility scooter access to Viper Barn (short intro film). Cowper's Kitchen, Hall and Parlour accessible by 1-2 shallow steps. Short films to watch in the Shop area for those unable to manage our stairs (over 3 floors). Museum has 6 small flights of stairs. Gardens have some narrow uneven paths. If you have people in your party that may struggle to keep up with a guided tour, the Tour Guide talk followed by the self-led option allows groups to go at their own pace.
